We, **George W. Byrd**, **Bryant Futrell**, and **R.A. Stone** are bound to the state in the penalty of six hundred dollars, witness our hands this 6th day of August, 1866 - the condition of the above obligation is such that whereas the above bound **George W. Byrd** has been appointed administrator of **John Byrd**, deceased. Now if the said **George W. Byrd** shall well and truly as such administrator perform all the duties, which are or may be required by law, then this obligation to be void otherwise to remain in full force and Virtue.
