John J. Crittenden Esq. Governor of the Commonwealth of Kentucky: TO ALL TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME, GREETING: Know Ye, that by virtue and in consideration of part of a land office Warrant, No. 582, there is granted by the said Commonwealth, unto **William C. Byrd**, apee (?) of **John J. McCaughan**, apee (?) of **Kain A. McCaughan**, a certain Tract or Parcel of Land, containing fifty Acres by survey, bearing date the 26th day of October one thousand eight hundred and forty seven, lying and being in the county of Stewart in the State of Tennessee South of Walker's Line and North of Latitude 36° 30' and bounded as follows (?) to wit: Beginning at a large black oak and small hickory on the East boundary line of **Robert Nelson's** 100 acre survey on Tennessee river, above the mouth of Lick Creek, thence E 66 poles to a post oak marked B, course continued 18 poles farther in all, 84 poles to a stake, thence N 95 1/4 poles to two small black oaks, thence W 84 poles to a stake on said line of **Nelson's**, thence with said line S 95 1/4 poles to the Beginning.

With its appurtenances: To have and to hold the said tract or

parcel of land with its appurtenances to the said **William C. Byrd** and his heirs forever.
