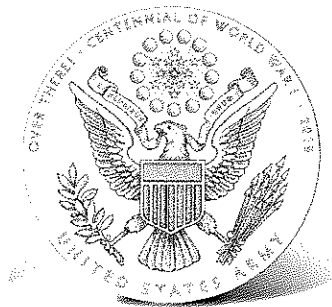

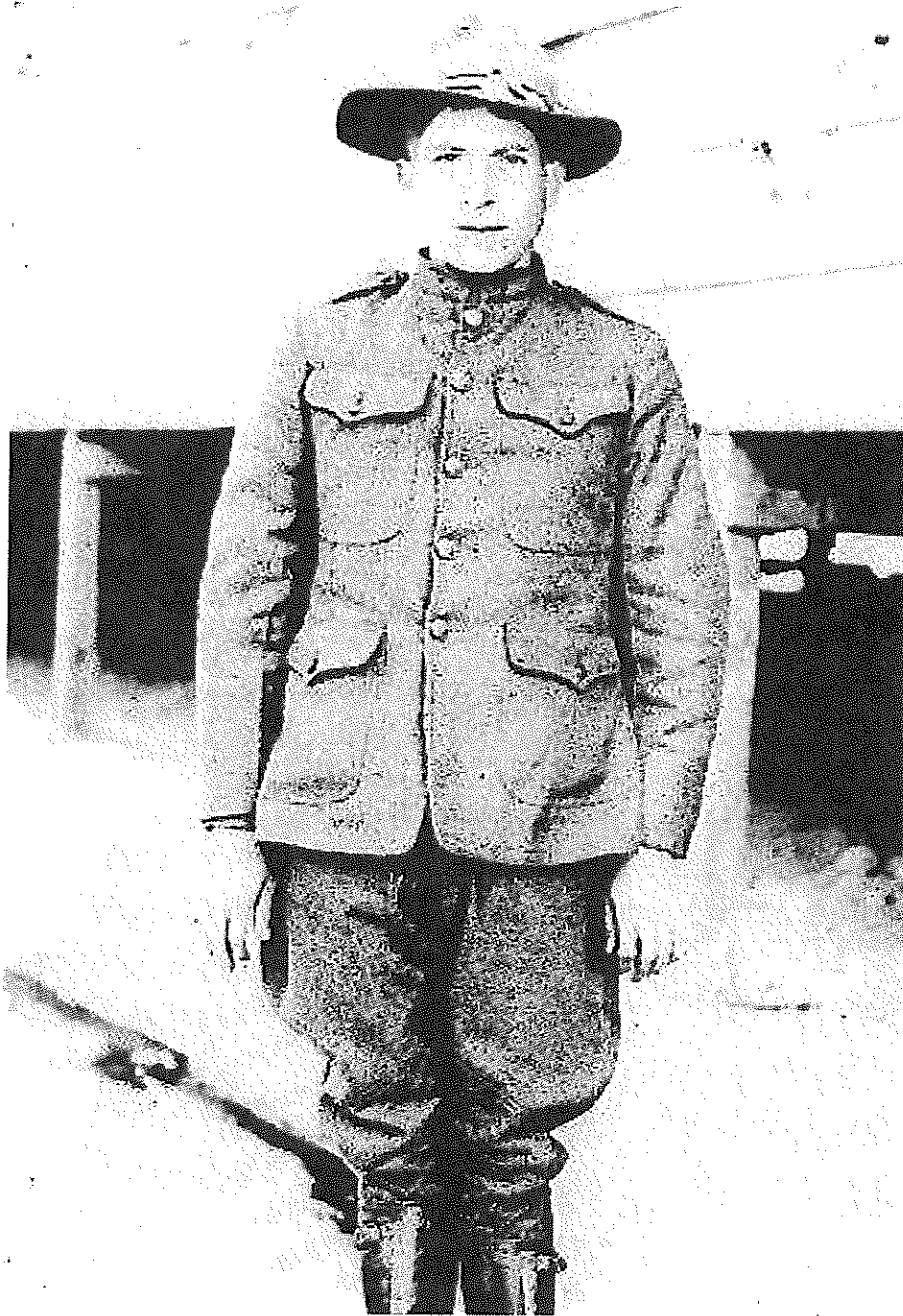

## LONNIE LEWIS

Feb. 24, 1890 – Sept. 1, 1918

Feb. 24, 1890: Alonzo McGregor Lewis was the 7<sup>th</sup> of twelve sons born to Elbert Lafayette Lewis and Sarah Samantha Hughes.

April 6, 1917: The U. S. entered WWI.

June 5, 1917: Twenty-seven year old Lonnie registered for the first Selective Service Draft along with his brothers, Horace, Charlie, Dallas and Walter. Lonnie's brother, Luther A. Lewis, had joined the Regular Army at Jefferson Barracks, MO Nov. 22, 1916 at 21 years old and was assigned to Co A 10<sup>th</sup> Machine Gun Battalion AKF. He served overseas May 16, 1918 – July 27, 1919.

July 15, 1917: Over the next several day, Lonnie Lewis and his brothers William L., Horace, Charlie and Dallas enlisted in the National Guard at Cumberland City, TN. They were all assigned to Company A 2<sup>nd</sup> TN Infantry Regiment National Guard and were all sent to a National Guard training camp at Camp Sevier, near Greenville, S.C.

Houston County men Berry Boyd, William A. Boyd, Jessie Boyd, James E. Tue, John T. Tue, Preston J. Cook, James L. Adams, Anderson Wynn, Elvis Stamper, Carl Bass O'Guin, Lester Durham and Roger Spears had all enlisted at Cumberland City, TN and joined the Lewis Brothers for training at Camp Sevier.

Lonnie and his brothers were excellent marksmen and quickly became known as the "Tennessee Squirrel Shootin' Bunch."

Co A 2<sup>nd</sup> TN Infantry National Guard was nationalized at Camp Sevier and became Company L 119<sup>th</sup> Infantry Regiment 60<sup>th</sup> Brigade 30<sup>th</sup> Division 2<sup>nd</sup> Corp National Army.

May 8, 1918: The entire 119<sup>th</sup> Infantry Regiment arrived by train at Camp Merritt, N.J. from Camp Sevier, S.C. They remained there for 3 days being equipped for overseas service.

May 10, 1918: Co L which was in the 3<sup>rd</sup> Battalion proceeded by rail to Boston.

May 12, 1918: Co L 119<sup>th</sup> Infantry left the harbor in Boston, Mass. on the British transport ship, "Laomedon" to join a convoy traveling overseas.

May 27, 1918: The "Laomedon" docked at Liverpool, England. From there they took a train to Dover, England then moved small detachments across the English Channel to Calais, France on the 29<sup>th</sup>. They spent 3 days in Calais being equipped with gas respirators and ammunition. Their U.S. rifles were exchanged for British rifles because the 30<sup>th</sup> Division was designated to serve with the British. The 3<sup>rd</sup> Battalion was billeted in Yeuse where they spent the next few weeks training with the British. The 119<sup>th</sup> was assigned to the British 4<sup>th</sup> Army.

Early July, 1918: The 119<sup>th</sup> Infantry became the first American unit to enter Belgium.

Sept. 1, 1918: Lonnie Lewis was KIA in Ypres, Belgium reportedly by sniper fire.

Sept. 6, 1918: Lonnie's 21 year old brother, Walter Lewis, had been drafted and was inducted into the Army five days after Lonnie was killed. Walter made it a total of seven brothers from one family to serve

in WWI. It was thought at the time, seven sons from one family was the largest number from one family to serve.

Sept 29, 1918: Walter Lewis headed overseas to France. He served in the Prisoner of War Escort Company # 250 until Aug. 23, 1919.

Sept. 28, 29, 30, 1918: With heavy hearts, Lonnie's four brothers continued to fight with the brave men of the 119<sup>th</sup> near Bellicourt. The "119<sup>th</sup> played a significant role in the breakthrough of the highly fortified German defensive position known as the Hindenburg Line." The 2<sup>nd</sup> American Corps, composed of the 27<sup>th</sup> and 30<sup>th</sup> Divisions attacked opposite the towns of Bony and Bellicourt, the strongest point in the line. The 3<sup>rd</sup> Battalion was to "mop-up" the area captured at the St. Quentin Tunnel. Companies I and L of the 119<sup>th</sup> were given the very dangerous job to "mop-up the tunnel alone." Those soldiers mopping up were to "have a full supply of smoke bombs and grenades." Lonnie's brothers Charlie and Dallas Lewis were both wounded on Sept. 29, 1918. Their older brother, William L. was wounded on Oct, 14, 1918. All three brothers returned to their units after they recovered. James L Adams, Preston Cook, William A. Boyd, James E. Tue and John Tue were also wounded while fighting with the 119<sup>th</sup>.

The 119<sup>th</sup> Regiment of the 30<sup>th</sup> Division fought in the following engagements:

July 16 - Aug. 30, 1918: Canal Sector

Aug. 31 – Sept. 2, 1918: Ypres – Lys Offensive

Sept. 20 – Oct. 20, 1918: Somme Offensive

Sept. 29, 1918: Spearheaded the break through the Hindenburg Line

November 11, 1918: Armistice signed.

March 21, 1919: While some of the wounded who served in the 119<sup>th</sup> came home early, Co L 119<sup>th</sup> Infantry embarked from St. Nazaire on the "USS Huron" for the U.S.

April 2, 1919: The 119<sup>th</sup> landed in Charleston, S.C. then moved by rail to Camp Jackson, S.C.

Apr. 9, 1919: Tennessee men were sent by rail to Ft Oglethorpe, GA where they were mustered out.

April 16, 1919: Tennessee men from Co. L 119<sup>th</sup> Infantry were discharged.

July 27, 1919: Luther A Lewis re-enlisted.

Sept. 3, 1919: Walter Lewis was discharged.

Perhaps the reason WWI ended when it did was because Field Marshall Von Hindenburg had heard about the four Lewis brothers of Erin, Tennessee who were packing up ready to go to training camp. Had the war lasted, Mr. and Mrs. Elbert L. Lewis of Erin, would have had eleven sons in the uniform of Uncle Sam.

Houston County Post of Erin wonders whether any other post can beat its record of having as members, six of the seven Lewis brothers who did serve in the World War. When the Post Adjutant, calling the roll reaches the name of Lewis, he reads: Horace L., Luther A., Dallas R., Walter E., William L., and Charles E. Lewis. The seventh, Lonnie M. 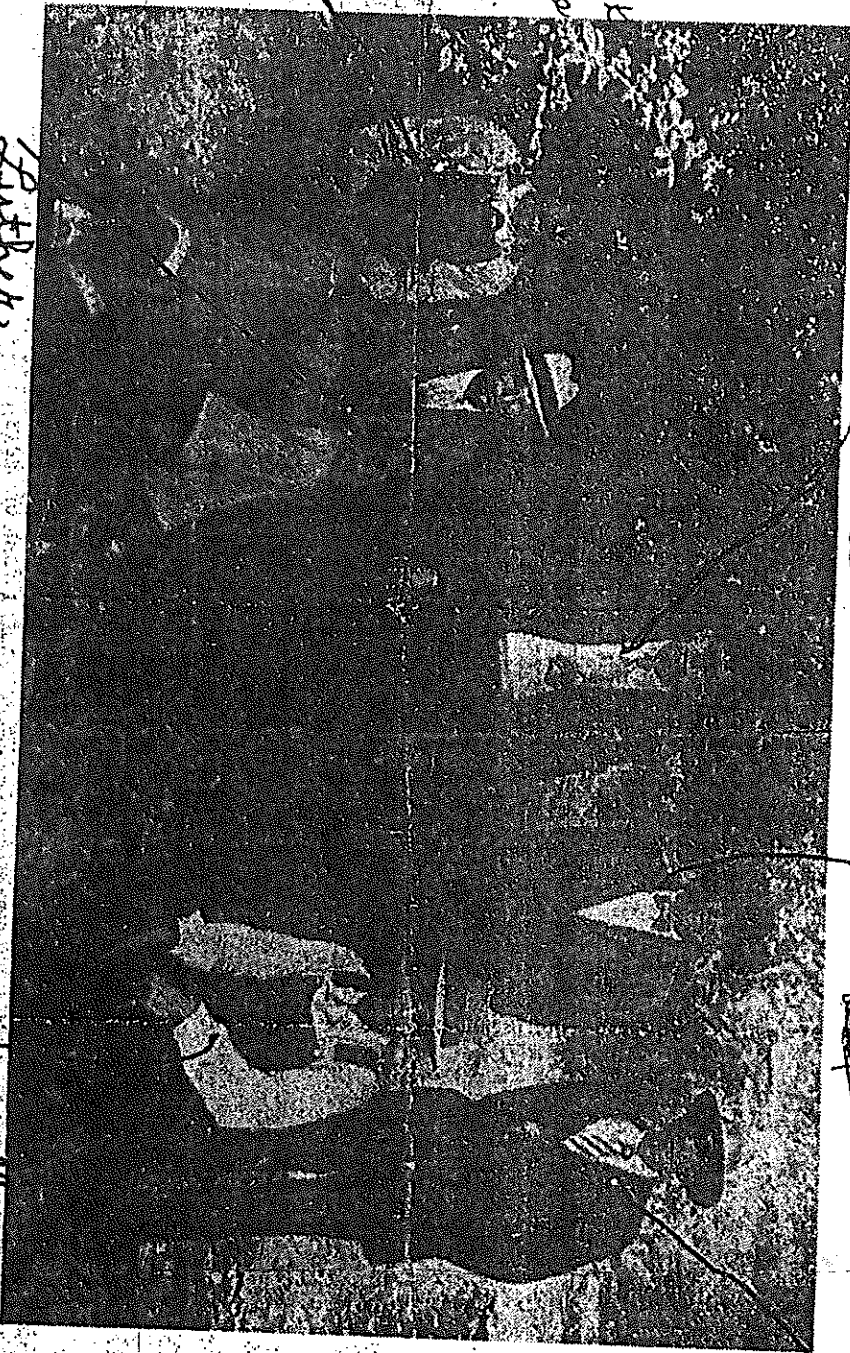

Elbert farmed along White Oak Creek where in 1877 he married Sarah Somathie Lewis. They built their home on this land and reared twelve sons. born from 1878 to 1899 John, William, James, George, Wylie, Horace, Lonnie, Dallas, Charlie Luther, Walter, and Paul. in the early 1900 this home was all but destroyed by fire, once rebuilt, this home still stands today.

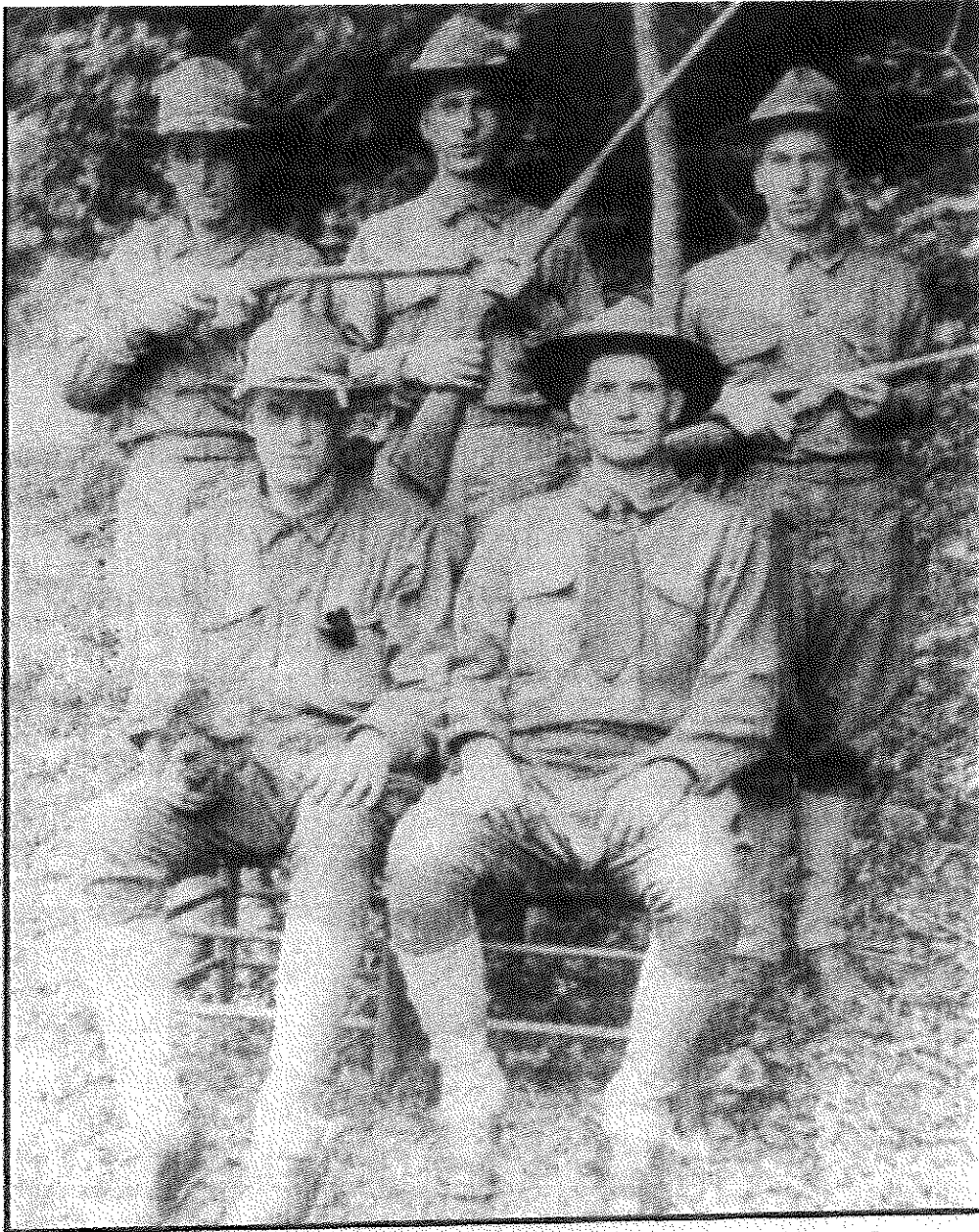
