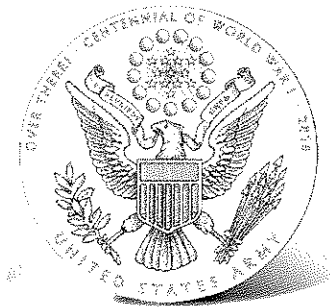

GEORGE DEADRICK OUTLAW, JR.

May 13, 1888 – Oct 1, 1918

May 13, 1888: George Deadrick Outlaw, Jr, the youngest of 11 children was born to George Deadrick Outlaw, Sr., a Civil War Veteran, and Mildred Baker.

April 6, 1917: The U.S. entered WWI.

June 5, 1917: George registered for the first Selective Service Draft at Danville, Tn. He was a Farmer, working for himself near McKinnon, TN. He was single.

Aug. 17, 1918: He reported to the local board at Erin, TN along with John Thomas Warden, Glenn Turner Griffin, Clyde Cathey and Nick Carl Meadow where they were all sent to Camp Gordon, GA to “fill deficiencies caused by physical rejections.” He was assigned to the 35th Company 9 Training BN 157 Depot Brigade.

Sept. 6, 1918: George was reassigned to the Camp Gordon Sept. Automatic Replacement Draft Co # 22 which was sent to Camp Merritt, N. J. for final preparation for their journey overseas.

Sept. 11, 1918: George Deadrick Outlaw, Jr, and fellow Houston County soldiers John Thomas Warden, George B. Haynes, Elmer H. Miller and James H Williams were assigned to the ship, “Olympic,” set to leave Camp Merritt from the Embarkation Center at Hoboken, NJ for France. James H. Williams became ill and was sent back to Camp Merritt. He survived and was sent overseas at a later date.

Sept 14, 1918: The “Olympic” departed for France.

Sept. 19, 1918: Influenza was declared an epidemic at Camp Merritt. Army training camps were hit hard by the worldwide influenza epidemic of 1918 which killed 20 million people. The influenza spread quickly in camps due to crowded conditions and frequent movement of troops.

Sept. 21, 1918: The “Olympic” arrived in France.

Oct. 1, 1918: George D. Outlaw, Jr. died of pneumonia, probably as a complication from influenza. (Some records have death date as Sept. 30, 1918.)

Oct. 8, 1918: Fellow Houston County soldier, John Thomas Warden also died.

More soldiers died of influenza in WWI than died in battle.

George D. Outlaws. Jr.’s body was returned home to be buried in Cane Creek Cemetery where he joined his Father who had donated the land for the cemetery and passed away in 1912.

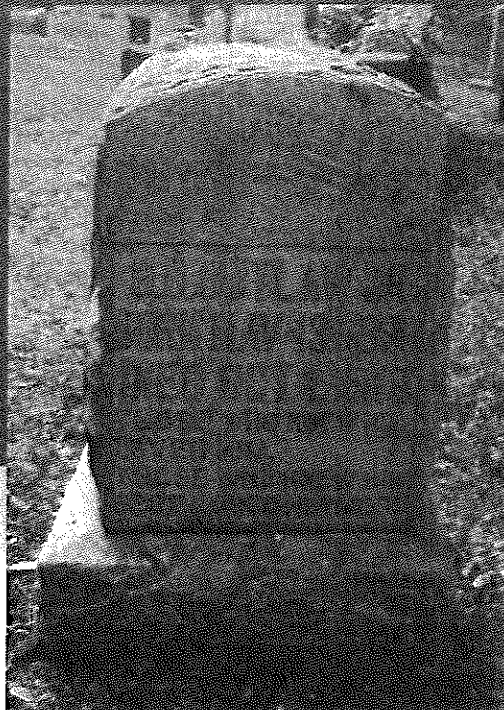
