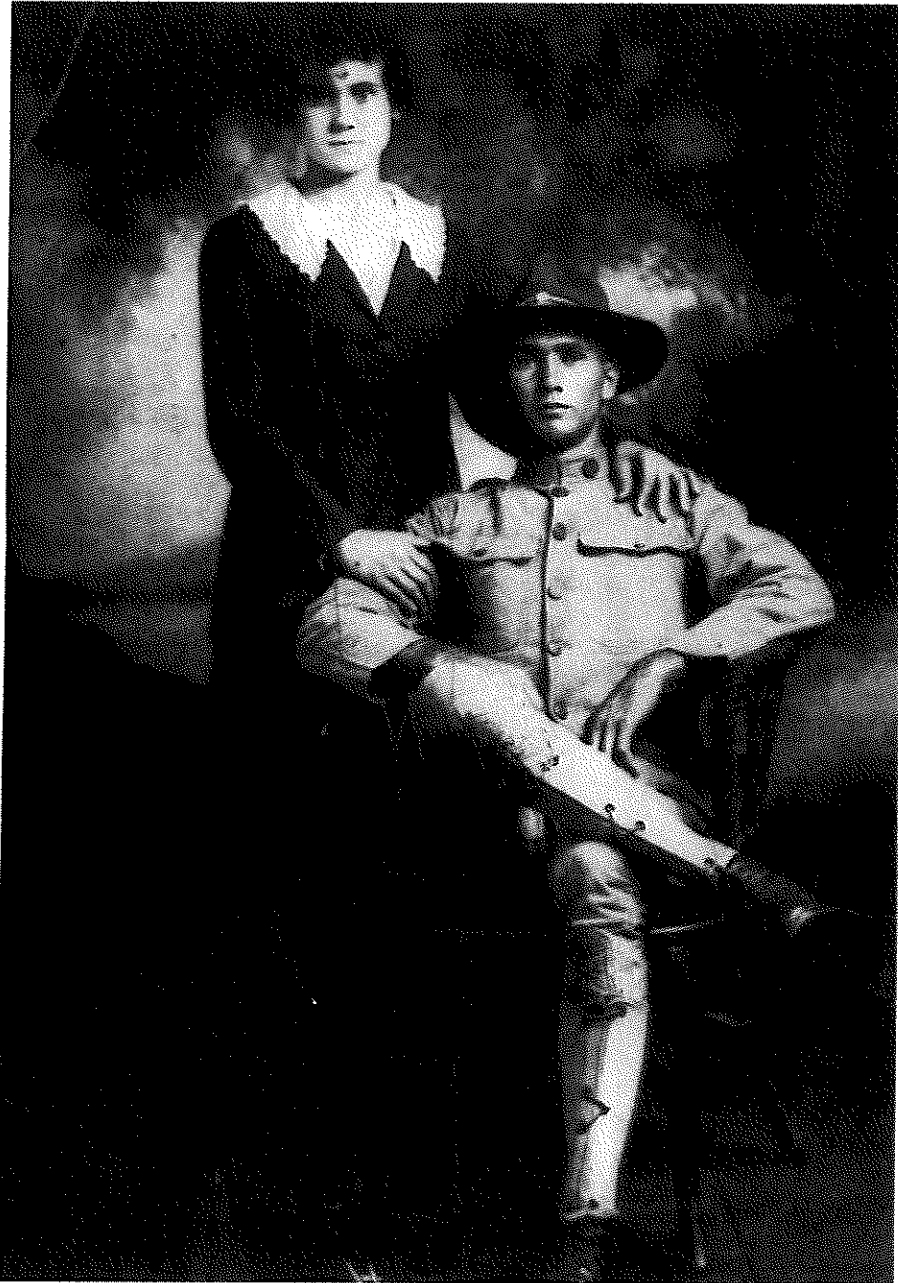

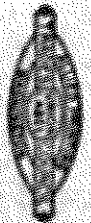

Mr. Roy Page Dies In Nashville

Mr. Roy Page, 74, a retired state highway employe, died in Veterans Hospital in Nashville Thursday, Sept. 21. - 1967

Funeral services were conducted by the Rev. Raymond Ward, assisted by the Rev. Foster Howard, Sunday, Sept. 24, at 2 p.m. at the Richardson Funeral Home with burial in Dripping Spring Cemetery.

Mr. Page was born in Logan County Aug. 14, 1893, the son of Luther and Fannie Wood Page. He married Minnie Ola Goley who died in 1936. He resided on East Second St., Russellville, and was a member of Dripping Spring Baptist Church and a veteran of World War I.

Surviving are one son, Harold (Buster) Page, Russellville; one daughter, Mrs. Rodney Lowery, Erin, Tenn.; two brothers, Will Page, Hopkinsville, Creed Page, Grand Junction, Colo.; and one granddaughter.
