Funeral services for Lucian Wyatt Rye, 87, were conducted Sept. 22 at 1:30 p.m. at Nave Funeral Home in Erin with the Rev. Paul Ford officiating. Burial was in Dickson County Memorial Gardens.

Mr. Rye died Friday at his residence at Route 1, Erin.
