

These are the children of Gersham (Gary) Alexander Bills and his wife Eugenia May Ogilvie. They begin with Anna Bell Bills at number 19 and extend through Alford A Bills at 30. My line begins with John Rush Bills at number 26.

Anna first appears in the 1880 census in Gersham's home having been born in 1874. She married John Travis Bryant in 1892. John is about 7 years older. They are shown in the 1900

census still in Navarro with their 6 year old son Wayne. In this census, John is listed as a teacher and Anna is a dry goods clerk. In his obituary, it mentions that John first came to Navarro to be the superintendent of schools in Navarro. I need to find some more information about this. I did note that in 1890, he was a student at the University of Texas in Austin.

John must have gotten out of the teaching business as the 1910 census finds him in Venus TX, which is near Midlothian, south of Dallas. His profession is a dry goods merchant and his 15 year old son Wayne is a

stock boy at a dry goods store. They had added a new son, Eldwin in 1902. I cannot find any details, but son Raymond arrived in 1905 and died in 1906. Son Wayne was called up for service in WW1 in the

Quartermaster Corp. It seems he served about 4 months at Camp Bowie, TX.

because 1920 finds them in Stamford TX which is out west north of Abilene. I ran across an article in the 1907 Abilene paper about John visiting Abilene in 1907, so maybe he was checking out the lay of the land. Again, no details have been found, but son Eldwin passed away in 1914. Oldest son Wayne married

Apparently, Venus wasn't big enough, in 1917, so the 1920 census finds John and Anna as empty nesters. John is still in dry goods. Unfortunately, Anna dies of asthma and heart failure in 1922 at the age of 48.

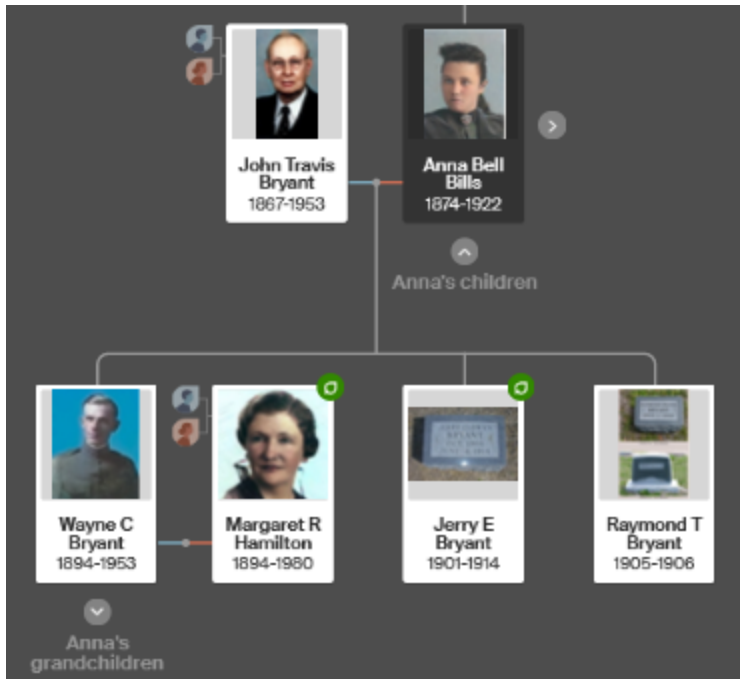
In 1930, John had moved in with his son Wayne and family in Ft Worth Both John and Wayne were involved in Dry Goods. .

Hallie was born in 1875 and first appears in her parent's home in the 1880 census as a 5 year old. She married Galer Ledford on 9 Nov 1899 and appears in the 1900 census as Galer's wife and they are living next door to her parents. Galer is shown to be working as a farm laborer so my suspicion is that he was hired by Gersham to work on his farm. Her father Gersham along with her youngest brother died on the same day in 1904.

By 1910, they lived in Hillsboro and Galer was in the grocery business. They had been busy having children with three daughters and a son ranging in age from 2 to 11. It appears that

another child was born between Abbie and Minnie since the 1910 census showed that Hallie had 5 children but only 4 surviving. I've tried to find more information about their grocery business, but so far I have not. Galer died in 1919 from TB per his death certificate.

I'm not sure exactly what happened with the census taker in 1920, but most of the ages and birth years

differ from the 1910 census. Hallie was still living in Hillsboro and is a widow with 6 kids ranging from 4 to 19. The only person listed as working in the census is the oldest daughter Lillian. She was a teacher. It's interesting that Lillian was found in the 1916 Hillsboro High School Yearbook as a sophomore which means when she was a teacher in 1920, she was only 2 years out of high school.

In the 1930 census, Lillian, Abbie, and Minnie had left the nest. Hallie had moved to Hubbard from Hillsboro and had two sons and a daughter still at home along with a 50 year old widowed roomer. The oldest son Truett is the only person in the household with an occupation listed, and he is a motion picture projectionist.

I hope to confirm this later after meeting with my newly discovered 2nd cousin Ruth Carmichael (Bellows) - granddaughter of Mary Dell and William. *(Note from Cousin Rebecca Fuller - Re: the Moore family picture. I believe the children are William Paul, Mayme, & Ben. Young boys were often dressed like girls.)*

Mary was born in 1877 in Navarro County and shows up initially in her parent's home in the

1880 census. She married William Pitts Moore on 22 June 1896 at which time she would have been 19. William is shown to have been a farmer, and like her older sister Hallie, they are living next door to Gersham and Martha. I wonder if Gersham was splitting up his land holdings to give his son's-in-laws a place to get a start. William was seven years older than Mary. Their first child, Elbert was born in early 1899, but unfortunately died in July of 1900. I do not know what caused his death.

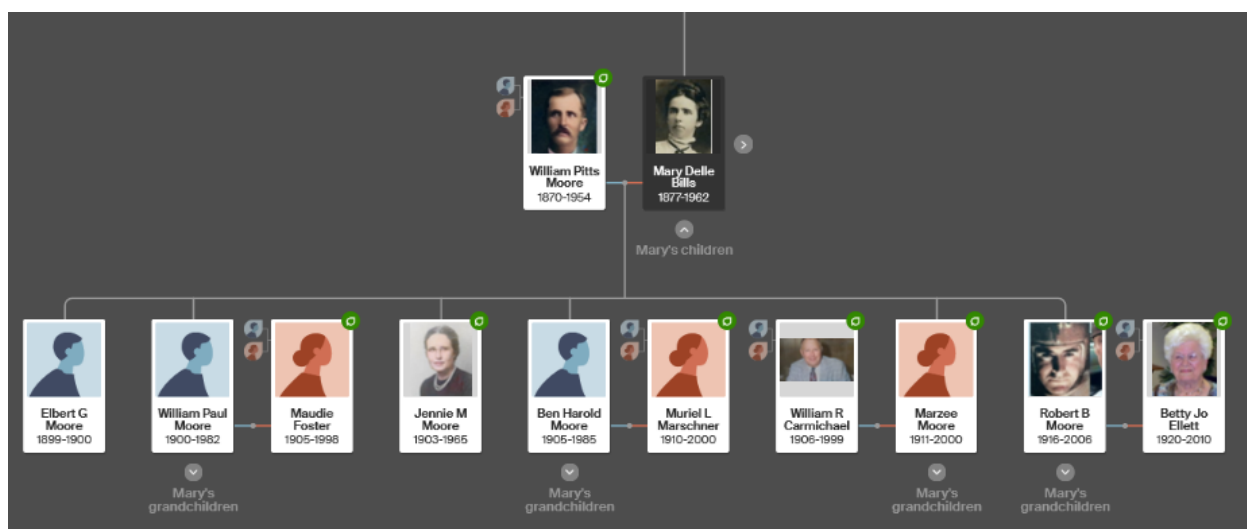
For some reason in 1940, they had moved back to Navarro County. There is a newspaper article in

1946 discussing the observation of their 50th wedding anniversary. In that article, it mentioned that they moved to Hill County in 1917 and then moved back to Navarro in 1937. It then mentions that they had lived in Frost since 1941.

In 1950, they lived in Frost and are still farming. William died in 1954 at the age of 83. Mary died in 1962 at the age of 84. At this time, per her death certificate, she was in a nursing home in Waxahachie. Her oldest son, Paul was the informant on her death certificate. It should be noted, and will be discussed later,

that Paul was the long time editor of the Corsicana newspaper.

I believe that Bethania went by Tennie so that is what I will use. She was born in 1879 and appears in the 1880 census and she's still at home in 1900 at the age of 21. However, she married Edward Moore on Christmas Eve of 1900.



It does not appear that he and William Pitts Moore were brothers, but they both came from the same place in Tennessee, so I suspect that I will find a relationship if I do some more digging. Perhaps they were cousins. His obituary notes that he moved to Texas from Tennessee in 1892.

Unlike her sisters, Tennie and Edward moved west moved to Floyd Texas by 1910 which is near Plainview (SE of Amarillo). Ed is listed as a stock farmer, and they have two daughters and a son. Luna and Vernon were both born in Emmett, Tx but Alice was born in Floyd, so that suggests they moved west between 1905 and 1910.

Floyd must have been a little too remote because in 1920, they were living in Pilot Point which is near Denton. They have had two more sons, and Ed is a farmer. All of the kids are still at home. His obituary adds that they actually moved to Mustang in 1913 which is 8 miles SE of Pilot Point.

They still lived in Mustang in 1930. Ed is still farming. Luna and Vernon have moved away, but the three

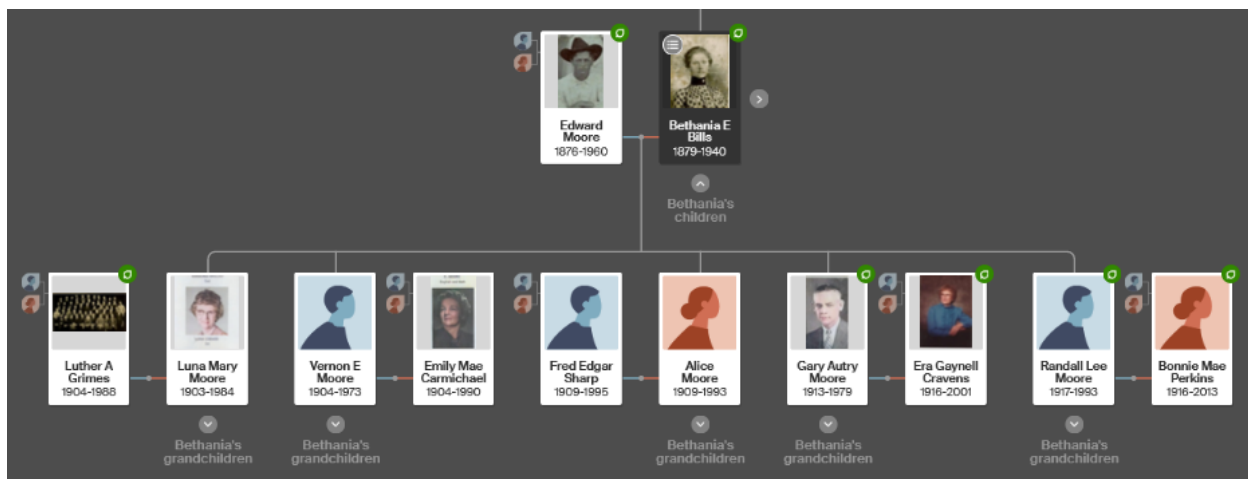
youngest are still at home. In Ed's obituary, it discussed his extensive involvement with the Mustang Methodist Church where he served as the Sunday School Superintendent for 27 years and was also on the Board of Managers and the music director.

I have not found a death certificate or an obituary for Tennie, but her tombstone shows that she died in 1940. She would have been 60 years old. There are notes on Ancestry that give the date of her death as 14 Jan 1940, but I cannot substantiate that. What we do know is that in the 1940 census that was taken in April, Ed is listed as a widower, so Tennie was dead by then. Ed is a 63 year old farmer. His obituary goes on to state that in 1941, he married Mabel Bryant. I believe that Mabel was Alice Mabel Ragland who was previously married to J L Bryant. I'm still researching details about her. She does appear with him in the 1950 census where Ed was 73 and she was 67. She died in 1952 and Ed died in 1960.

There is a Find-A-Grave entry for Willie showing his birth date and death date, but I have been unable to document either. According to this he only lived 3 months.

As with his brother Willie, Find-A-Grave is the only source I have for the dates here. According to this he only lived 5 months.

A bit of speculation here - Gersham's sister-in-law, Mollie Ogilvie Bills died in 1883 after giving birth to Ida. I may have mentioned previously, that in Circle of Love, it states that Gersham's wife took baby Ida in and raised her until her death in 1890. It would seem to make a little sense for that to have happened given that Eugenia had just lost two sons in a row.

Gersham, who went by G. A. Bills was born in 1884, so he didn't show up until the 1900 census as 15 year old Autry. I'm not sure where Autry came from, but it ended up being my father's middle name so it must have been a family name from someone. My mother referred to him as Uncle Aut. He died shortly before I was born, but Mary didn't die until 1971, but I do not remember meeting her. G. A. and Mary were married on 24 Dec 1907. I note that his older sister Tennie also married on Christmas Eve 1900.

In the 1910 census, G. A. and Mary are shown as farmers in Young County. It was interesting to note that Mary

is listed as a farm laborer. They must have moved to Loving, Tx shortly after their 1907 marriage in Navarro County.

It should be noted that Gersham and Mary never had any children so all of their census entries are similar with the only thing changing is their age. I have run across a probate entry from 1924 from which Mary inherits 1/5th interest in a 200 acre farm in Navarro County from her mother. I cannot find them in the 1930 census, but they are in both the 1940 and 1950 censuses at the same location. In her Find-A-Grave entry, it said that she was the Loving correspondent for the Graham Leader for many years. I need to spend some time on this website which has all issues of the Graham Leader from 1876 to 2011. I think that it will be a gold mine of trivia about our family.

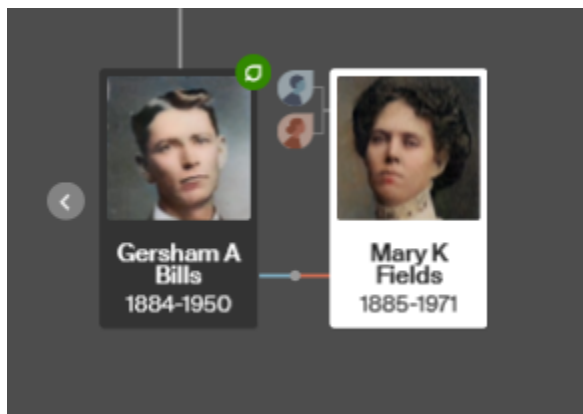
Another note about G. A. and Mary was that since they had no children, they took a liking to my Uncle Donald. Donald was the third son of G. A. 's younger brother, John Rush Bills (my grandfather) and was a twin of Dorothy Bills. My mother indicated that there was a bit of resentment from his brothers and sisters as he was treated like an only child while the others were just poor farm kids with 6 other siblings.

G. A. died in Dec 1950 and Mary died in 1971. I haven't thoroughly researched Mary, but from a brief

look, it appears that her mother was married to James Fields. He died in 1888 and she married Cleanel Stone who was a widower with several kids, so she would have grown up in a blended

family.

These are my grandparents. I believe that granddad went by Rush. Unfortunately, he died right before my first birthday so I did not ever know him. I saw a news clipping describing how my family had just arrived for a visit and he had a heart attack and died. Rush was born in 1887 and Clemmie was born in 1890 in Emmett, a small town in Navarro County. They both first appear in their respective parent's homes in the 1900 census, and both were attending school. They married in 1908 in Emmett when Rush was 21 and Clemmie was 18. Both of their fathers were farmers.

After their marriage and the birth of their first child, they move west to Loving Tx in Young County, just north of Graham. My maternal grandfather, T. C. Butler, lived in Loving at the time and was single working as a druggist. I found a newspaper article from August 1909 talking about Tom Butler purchasing the Loving Dug Store. As with most of Gersham's children, Rush was a farmer.

In 1920, Rush was still farming and the family was growing. Uncle JR and Pat had arrived. Leota and JR were both in school and JR was also listed as a farm laborer. I'm not sure why there was such a big gap between JR and Pat. I have not found any evidence of a child

that died.

Clemmie's mother died in 1923 in Temple Texas so sometime before 1930, James Anderson Cook, her father, moved to Loving and moved in with Rush and Clemmie and their growing family. As

can be seen in the enumeration, Leota was married and moved out. JR was still at home as was Pat. The twins, Dorothy and Donald had arrived as had my father Jack. Great grand dad Cook is pictured here.

In the 1940 census, JR had married and moved away. Don, Dorothy, and Jack are teenagers and they have a new little sister, Mary Glynn. This is the census before WW2, and during the war all of the children (including Dorothy) except Leota and Mary Glynn served in the armed forces. In 1943, granddad Cook passed away.

In 1950, it appeared that they had moved into Graham, but they still owned the farm. All of the children had married and moved away so Rush and Clemmie were empty nesters.

As mentioned earlier, Rush dropped dead of a heart attack in 1952 and Clemmie lived until 1970. The story is told that after Rush died, Clemmie had a sister in Tyler that was also a widow. They decided that they should live together, but neither wanted to give up their house, so they rotated month to month between Graham and Tyler. On one of the trips back to Graham, Clemmie's sister was bringing her back and about halfway back she asked Clemmie how she was doing, but got no response. Looking over, she saw that grandmother was dead. Not knowing what to do, she stopped at a funeral home in the nearest town asking for advice. The funeral director told her that it would be much more cost effective if she just



drove on to Graham with Clemmie’s body. She said that it was a very uncomfortable drive. At the time of her death, my parents lived in Kuwait and I was over visiting. Dad decided that he needed to return for the funeral, so I stayed in Kuwait with my mother and younger sister and we went ahead on a trip that had already been planned to Cyprus.

Mattie was born in 1889 in Emmett, TX. She appears in the 1900 census with her parents. Her father died in 1904 so in 1910, she was still in her mom’s home at age 20 with two younger brothers. Her youngest brother died on the same day as his father in 1904. In 1910, Clarence was a marine stationed aboard the USS Missouri stationed in the Boston Shipyard I think, but the information in the 1910 census is rather sketchy. It does not show his age or birthplace and I cannot find anything on Fold3. There is also another record listing Clarence Coxsey aboard the USS Minnesota in 1907 indicating that he had enlisted in Mar 1907. If this is the same Clarence, then he must have mustered out in time to marry Mattie in 1912.

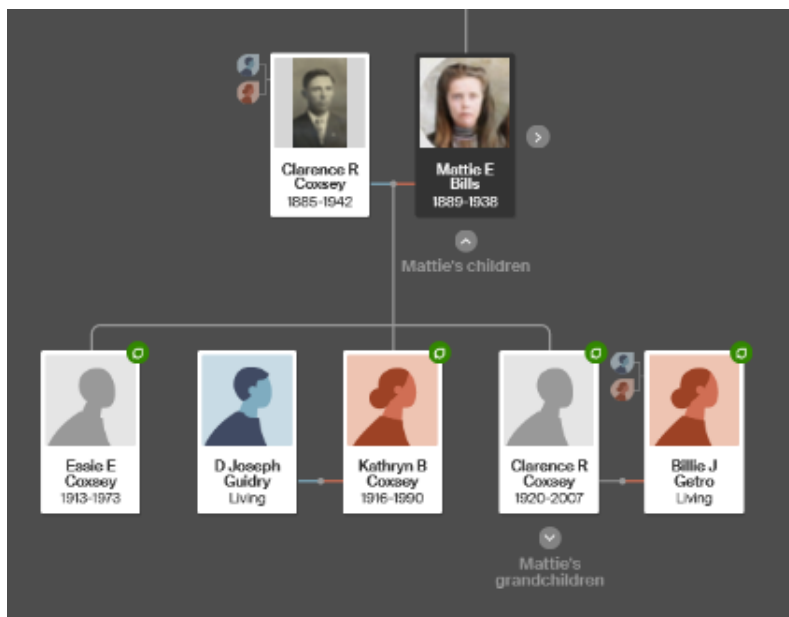

By 1920, they had moved to Post Texas which is way out in west Texas between Lubbock and Snyder. They had two daughters and as with most of these folks, they are farming. Their son Clarence was born in Nov 1920 in Lynn TX which must have been a little bigger town further west. I don't

By 1930, they moved back east to Shelby, TX which is between Brenham and La Grange. Young Clarence appears in this census with his two older sisters. Mattie died in 1938. On her death certificate it says that they were living in Tenaha, TX which is out east of Nacogdoches. Her cause of death is difficult to read,

1940 found the widowed Clarence living in Anderson County with his son Clarence. In 1942 however, he filled out an Old Man's Draft Registration that indicated he was living in Houston and that his next of kin was Ben Moore. If my calculations are correct, Ben was a nephew, the son of his sister-in-law Mary Dell (Bills) Moore. During the war, all of his children served in the armed forces. I will cover their service under their page. There is a marriage record in 1943 for C. R. Coxsey and Lena Richardson. I have not found the 1950 census for Clarence and any other confirmation. There is a Find-A-Grave for Lena Richardson that does not mention Clarence so I'm uncertain about this. He would have been a widow for five years at this time and lived another 24 years so it would not be surprising.

Coxsey, and three children, Miss Essle Gene, a graduate nurse employed at the new Jefferson Davis Hospital, Houston; Katherine, doing second year work in nursing at the Jefferson Davis Hospital, and Raymond, a senior in Center high school. Leota was born in 1891 in Frost TX and appears in the 1900 census for the first time as the youngest daughter of Gersham and Eugenia. She next appears in the 1910 census after Gersham's death. Mattie and Lewis are the only other kids still at home since her youngest brother died on the same day as her father.

On 9 Nov 1910, she married Isaac Lycurgus Moore in Navarro County. He apparently went by Curg and I don't blame him! He was the younger brother of William Pitts Moore who had married her older sister Mary Dell.



In 1920, they had moved to Mustang TX in Denton County and as with all the others, they were farming. Their only daughter was born in 1915 in Navarro County, and they moved to Mustang in 1917 per Curg's obituary.

The Moore's lived their entire lives in Mustang after moving there in 1917. Per Curg's obituary, they were active in the community to include serving as the treasurer of the Mustang

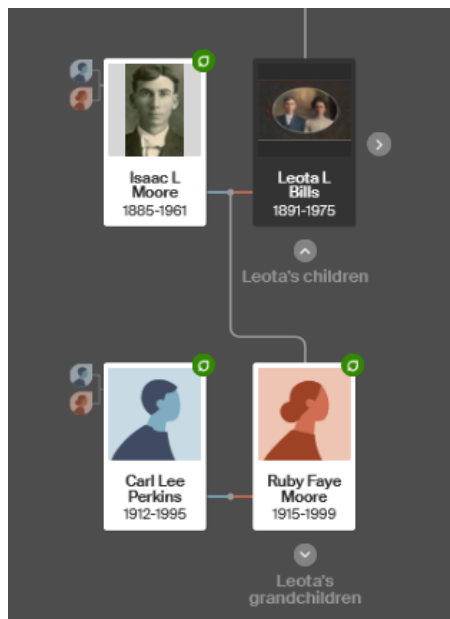

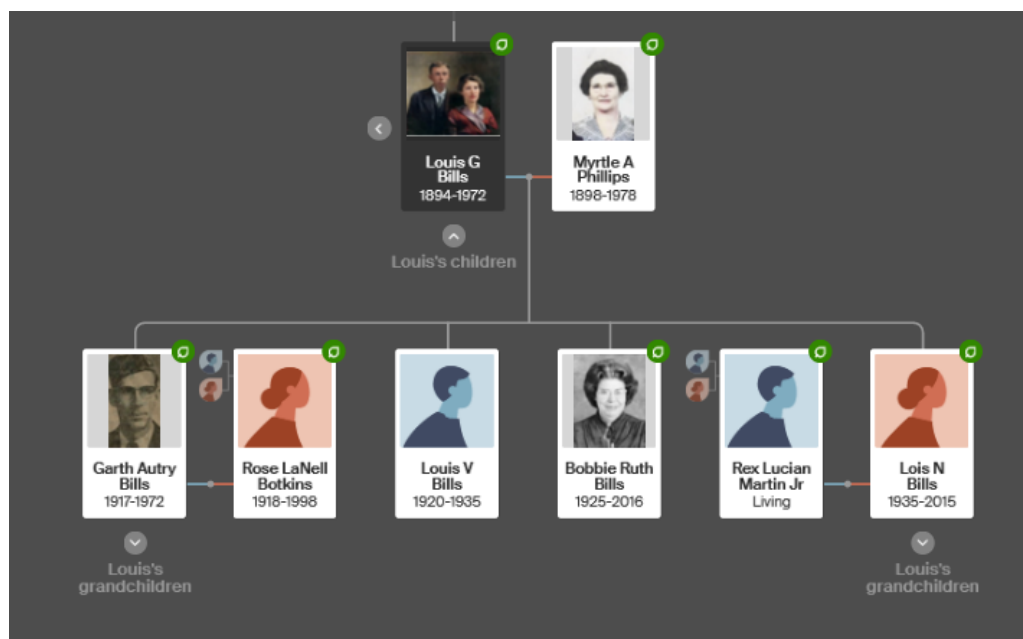
