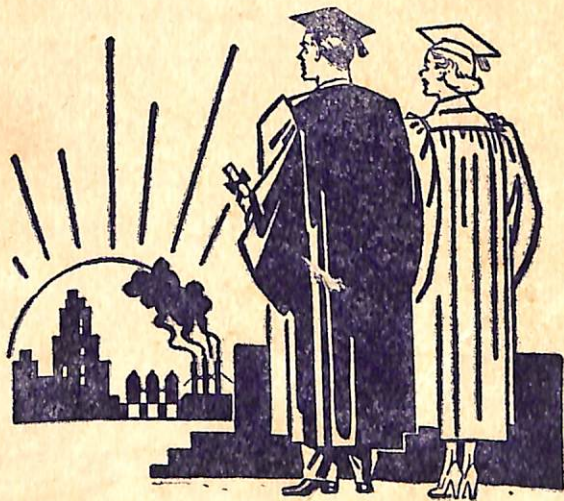

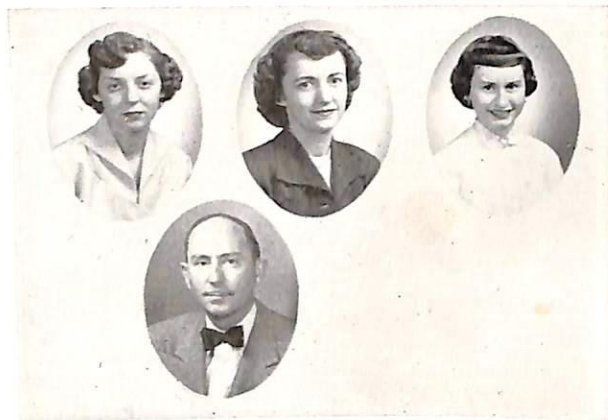

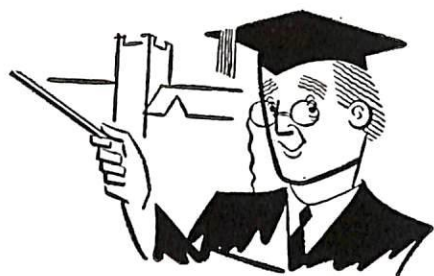

Class Prophecy

"Oscar! For heaven's sake, quit leaning out of the window. This is the last time I intend to tell you to sit down."

The noisy hub-bub of the children ceased — but only for a moment. Then they resumed their excited chattering.

It seemed that the closer we came to our destination, the more difficult it became to control our enthusiastic wards. She was just telling them that *Benny Parks*, her husband, had thought she needed a vacation so while she came to the Fair he stayed at home with the seven kids. Hearing the laughter of children, we turned and saw an unusual sight — a cage of monkeys sent from the South American Monkey Farm of renowned hunters, *Richard Weakley*, *Billy Channell*, *Bob Batson*, and *Jimmy Slate*.

After viewing the livestock, we saw the Household Exhibits, where *Faye Roake*, *Olympia Coakley* and *Juanita Sykes* were demonstrating an amazing new invention — a tearless onion peeler. *Bernice Bourne*, *Betty Joyce Thweatt*, and *Dorothy Ann Blair* held the attention of a large crowd as they explained how to bake a cake that would never fall.

We were interested in the many agricultural projects. *Margaret Foust's* newest development was a Lemana tree which produced both lemons and bananas on the same plant. *John Smith* and *Dick Clardy* amazed everyone with their practical plant — corn that pops on the stalk and is already buttered and salted. The demand for this remarkable plant was so great that they had five secretaries taking orders — *Alberta Potter*, *Glenda Manning*, *Watha Rose*, *Marilyn Havis*, and *Pauline Frazier*. *W. L. Smith* and *John Evans* proudly showed us their prize-winning cu-

cumber which weighed thirty-five pounds.

We next visited the Aviation Show where famous airships which had made history were on display. One of the most famous of these was the model of the ship constructed by *Rucj Uffelman* for the first flight to Mars. *General Bobby Agerton*, *Admiral Robert Foust*, and their aides *Wayne DePriest*, *Joseph Slate*, *Lewis Bryan*, and *Ralph Edwards* had left the first day of the Fair on this trip, but as yet no word had been received from them. Another famous jet on display had been flown around the world by *Isabel Evans* and *Bette Fortson* to set a new record.

Among the many large buildings that we visited was the modern *Seay and Ross Building* owned by *Marshall Seay* and *Howard Ross*. This unusual building, which had been constructed by *Bobby Dozier* and Company, had no doors. 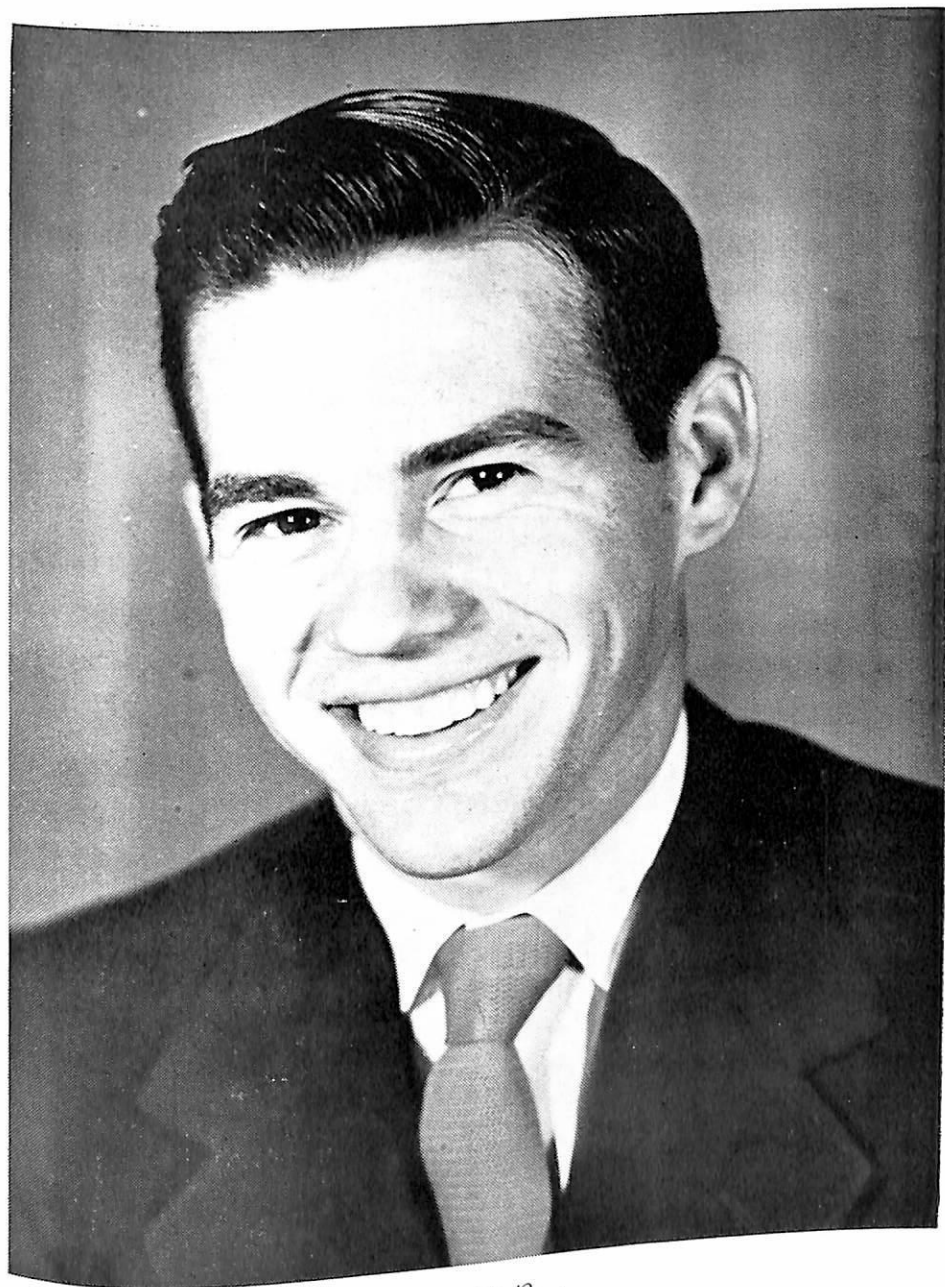

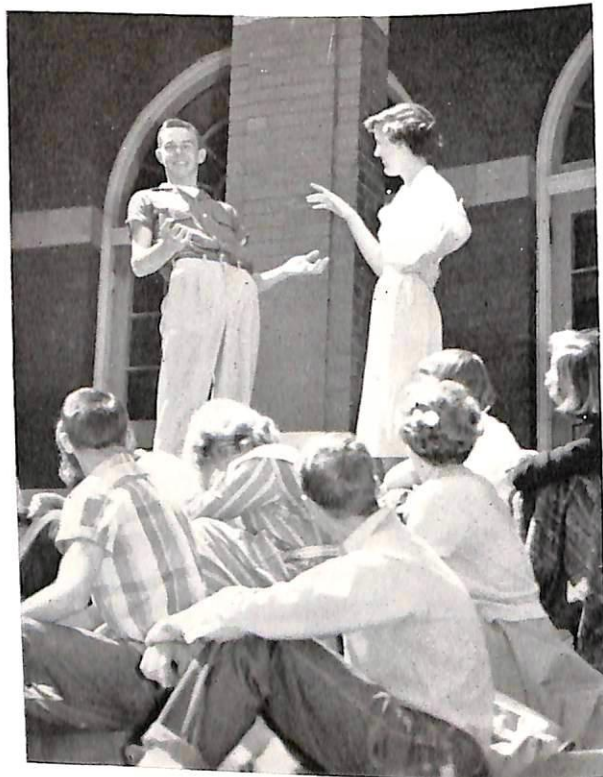

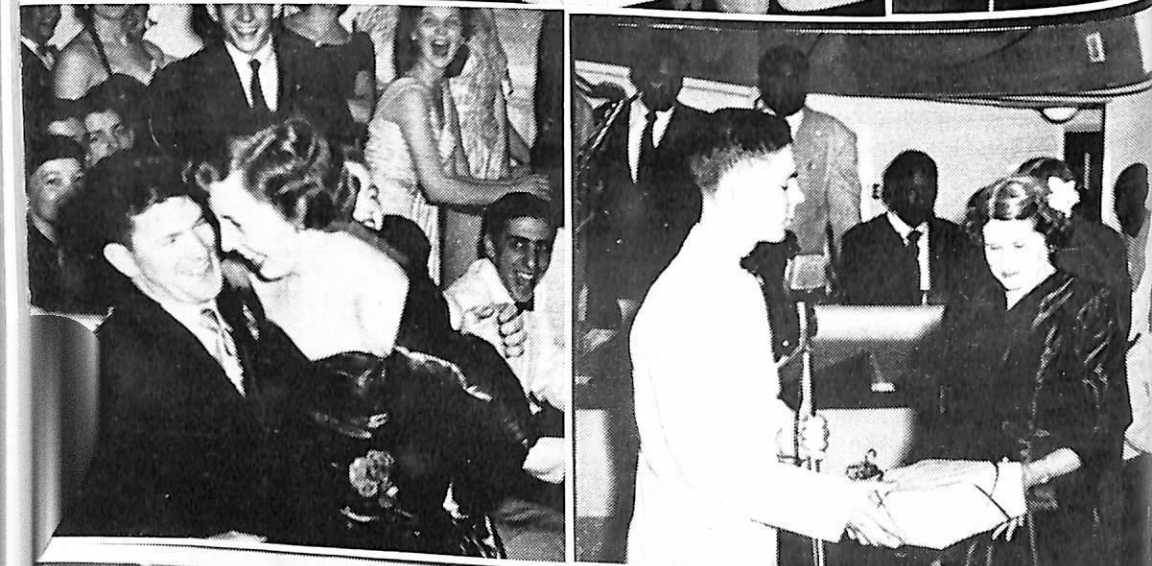
