From the Mayflower and Plymouth Rock

Our WCGA group was entertained by Cheryl Watson Mingle as she led the January genealogy program by sharing her ventures to Plymouth Rock, Massachusetts. As a member of the General Society of Mayflower Descendants, she shared her Watson lineage from Warren County back to Stephen Hopkins and the Mayflower with its arrival at Plymouth Rock.

 until 3:00 p.m. on April 17, 2013, in the early voting room
 to document Civil War memorabilia.
- Ladye Hunter announced that Darryl Norris is updating our CD of past Bulletins to include 2010, 2011 and 2012. The Bulletins 1992 through 2012 are \$25.00 each. Shipping cost is \$3 for first CD and \$1.75 each additional CD.
- Pat Berges distributed revised brochures that include the newly updated Books for Sale list.

The Ever Popular "Show and Tell" Entertained us with...

Glenda Cantrell's entertaining presentation of a box of old love letters approaching 100 years old. A gift from her uncle.

Carolyn Lance's picture and ID bracelet from her uncle Marion Floyd Dantzler 1897-1918 who was in the U.S. Navy during WW1. The ID bracelet has his name with dates 4/26/18 (1918) and birthdate 1/16/97 (1897) and the inscription UNRF. Inside is an engraved fingerprint.

Larry Boyd's pictures made from small locket-type tintype photos of his maternal great-grandparents William Pleasant Anderson (1842-1889) and his wife Mary Elizabeth Austin Anderson (1847-1907) of Lost Creek, White Co., TN. "Bill" Anderson was a cobbler (made shoes) & musician who played the bugle for his Confederate outfit. He was captured at Fort Donelson, held as a POW at Camp Morton, IN, and exchanged at Vicksburg, Miss., and returned to his unit. He died at age 46 1/2 yrs. Likely he departed this life early because of the hardships & deprivations suffered during his military service to help defend the State of Tennessee from an invasion from a hostile force.

Wanda Gant's baby bracelet from the old Warren County Clinic that was located on Main Street in McMinnville. She also brought along a doll dress made from flower sacks.

Allen Jaco's experience as a WW2 naval officer assiged to a transport ship whose primary function was to transport European permanent immigrants from Germany to the U.S. In 2010, while shopping in McMinnville Walmart, he met a clerk who had a European accent and found that she had been a passenger on his ship when she was 7 years old.

Marion Rhea Speaks's presentation of the bugle she was given by her uncle Samuel Anderson. The bugle was from WW2 and was won by her uncle in a card game. She was given the bugle because she was the first person in the family who learned to play taps on the instrument.

Bonita Mangrum's photos from the William Stewart family who moved from Warren Co. before 1860. These photos were sent back to his grandson George Washington Newby who is pictured along with his wife Harley Edge. Another picture presented, but not shown was of grandson Leburn Stewart.
