Marcia Marchbanks Ramsey was February WCGA Guest Speaker



We often have guest speakers who talk and inform us about their ancestors, but we aren't always entertained as well. Marcia Marchbanks Ramsey did just that while talking about her Smith and Spurlock families.

She is the daughter of the late Ione and Joe Marchbanks who was the fourth child of Phillip 1896-1988 and Ruby Spurlock Smith 1897-1989, both born in Warren County. They were descendants of Button and Marie Burks Smith and Billy and Mary Snelling Spurlock.

Phillip and Ruby were married in 1917 and were the parents to 9 children with 2 passing at very early ages.

During the depression Phillip worked on roads for the WPA and in later years was a custodian for First Baptist Church and later Central Church of Christ in McMinnville. In 1936 he and oldest son Billy built the family home that still stands today.

There are some things we all learned from them and a few they tried to teach us. From Phillip three things come to mind: (1) Never borrow and never lend; (2) Always pay your bills on time; (3) If it doesn't look right or smell right, don't eat it. One family member commented "If grandpa won't eat it, don't give it to me." From Ruby we got (1) Love your enemies; (2) Forgive and forget; (3) Turn the other cheek and (4) If you go fishing on Sunday, you'll catch the devil.

Ruby was a homemaker and did washings and ironings for other folks and helped with their spring cleaning. She was the easy going one and always went to church. She enjoyed going to visit the sick with her friends on Sunday. She had a green thumb and grew some of the prettiest flowers you ever saw. She could take old scrap pieces of material and make a beautiful quilt. She could make some of the best bread, rice and tomato puddings and fried pies you ever tasted. Later in life she

babysat for several of her grand and great grandchildren.

Phillip raised a garden every year as well as hogs and chickens. After retirement he got up early and walked daily. He also loved to fish and he and his buddies were known as "Cool and the Gang".

Since their union in 1917 the Phillip and Ruby Smith family has grown to 23 grandchildren, 40 great grandchildren and 17 great great grandchildren.

Phillip died in 1988 and Ruby in 1989. They are buried at Gardens of Memory cemetery in McMinnville.







Do You Think You Are Trying To Connect To Warren County?

77 people have proven it!

They received Certificates for

Warren County – McMinnville First Pioneer Families

There's still time for you to make your connection by submitting copies of an official record linking you to Warren County before 1820. Those records can be birth, marriage,



death, probate or will, church, cemetery, funeral or obituary, land records, tax records, court, military records, census, newspaper, or Bible for each generation, including the applicant.

To qualify for a certificate, suitable for framing, the applicant must directly descend from an ancestor (male or female) who was in Warren County no later than the 1820 census (this includes the boundaries of the original formation of Warren County from White county).

There is a \$10 application processing fee + \$3.50 shipping for the certificates. All applications and verifying material become the property of the Warren County Genealogical Association.
