## We Reached a Milestone

The Warren County Genealogy and Historical Association is pleased to announce that over 100 McMinnville-Warren County Pioneer Certificates have been awarded to descendants of our pioneer settlers of Warren County. We are excited to have surpassed the 100th earmark of descendants who have proven their line of descent from their Pioneer Ancestor. The WCGHA's Pioneer Family Project was established as a way for descendants to honor our McMinnville-Warren County Pioneer Ancestors who paved the way for the place that we call home today.

There are three major sources to find these ancestors: 1806/1807 Petition to Form Warren County, 1812 Warren County Tax List and 1820 Warren County Census. Surprisingly, only 56 of these Warren County Pioneers have descendants who have qualified for certificates. There are just over 1300 individuals in the 1806/1807 Petition and the 1812 Tax List. Of this group, only 35 Pioneers have descendants who have qualified for certificates.

J. B. Brown was presented Certificate #100 for his ancestor, Bartlett Wright (b. 1750) from WCGHA President Cheryl Watson Mingle who received Certificate #001 for her ancestor, William Nunley (b. 1794). Others

receiving certificates at the January Members Meeting on January 18th were: Tonia Brown Valazquez, Charles W. Stiles, Jr., James Dean, Jathan Daniel Bogle, Braylon Kole Bogle, Shyanne Brook Bogle, Alaynah Taylor Bogle, Shayna Marquee Jacobs, and Shyera Rayne Jacobs.

Of the 56 ancestors that have been honored, Absalom Brown (b. 1778) tops the list with the most descendants - 12 descendants who have received their certification. Other Warren County Pioneers having multiple descendants receiving certificates include: William Thomas Bond (b. 1766) – 8; Thomas C Gribble (b. 1776) - 7 descendants; Richard Crouch (b. 1780) – 6; John McGee (b. 1767) - 5 descendants; Leroy Hammons, (b.1785-1787) and James David Hennessee, (b. 1776) – 4 descendants; Richard Tenpenny, (b.1766) – 3 descendants and several with 2.

WCGHA member, Glenda Stubblefield Cantrell has successfully proven her line of descent from 10 Warren County Pioneers. Others who have proven their line of descent from multiple ancestors are: Cheryl Watson Mingle (6), J. B. Brown (5), Cody Prince (4), Shirley Eulene McGee Douglas (3), Angela Eulene Douglas




