

AN HISTORIC OLD SPRING

The guest speaker for our August 19th meeting was Dr. Neil Schultz. He gave extensive details on a historic spring located across the road from the current McMinnville Farmer's Market. Originally, the spring had a large stone outcropping or ledge that provided shelter to many travelers. In later years, it fell into disuse, and was considered dangerous by local owners in Depot Bottom. The only access was between two buildings, and that access was blocked off. Soon it was all but forgotten, except for Dr. Schultz!

He and some associates purchased the property to gain access to the spring. Along with other volunteers, the area was cleared of years' worth of trash and debris. Did I mention the cave? It is believed that the entrance to the spring may connect to caves running beneath the City of McMinnville. The entrance is currently blocked, but it is fascinating to think that one day it might be open for exploration.

Guidelines to help the genealogist when asking questions of the archivist

- ⇒ Be as specific with your request as possible. The more specific your question is, the better the archivist will be able to help you.
- ⇒ Please don't ask "I want everything for the Smith family". This question will not be beneficial to you or the archivist. It will only serve to make the process of searching for records more difficult.
- ⇒ Call Ahead! Ask the archivist about specific records such as vital records, deed records, court records, etc. and what the archive has available. Understanding if the archive has the records you are looking for before you even step foot in the facility will save you precious research time.
- ⇒ Ask the archivist about Vertical Files. This records collections is one that I find many genealogists just don't know about or know to ask for.

Ask the archivist about Manuscript Collections. Remember that these records are stored in back rooms and will need to be requested.

The next time you are visiting an archive, talking with an archivist on the phone or sending an email, communicate your needs to the archivist. Source: It's Not All Online, Researching in Archives
