



Could you be a descendant of one of Warren County's early settlers who have **not** been researched and honored as a **Pioneer Ancesto**r?

Have fun researching and uncovering a family story. Share the story with your children, grandchildren, cousins, siblings or any other family members or friends. Pioneer Ancestor certificates make great gifts.

Some early settlers, not researched, but with intriguing stories are EZEKIEL & WILLIS MCGREGOR, born 26 Nov1784 in North Carolina, twins, who married sisters, Sarah Jane "Sallie" Ware (15 Dec 1786 – 20 Apr 1856) & Susannah (Susan) Ware (15 Dec 1787-25 May 1871). Sallie and Susan are sisters to Isham Ware. Isham was recently recognized with certificate #140 received by Lucas Holt. Ezekiel and Willis appear to be sons of William McGregor.

Preliminary research for these McGregor twins provides interesting tidbits for further research. Ezekiel and Willis McGregor both appear on the 1812 tax List and the 1820 Warren County Census. On the 1812 tax list, they were enumerated by Samuel Colville in what was the 1st District of Warren County at that time.

Will Book 1-3, page 302-303 lists Ezekiel's wife, "Sallie", names some children and grandchildren and gives a bequest for his blacksmith tools. His will indicates he was a landowner at the time the will was written.

Ezekiel died 23 Sep 1856. Ezekiel and his wife, as well as some of their children, are buried at Smyrna Cemetery. Warren County Cemetery Book # 4 provides more information about these families.

Some children listed for Ezekiel and Sarah Jane "Sallie" are:

ClintonMcGregor, (14Apr1824-11Nov 1874). Clinton married three times. He married 1st Phebe C. Biles born 26 July1822; 2nd Melcana Myers born 12 May 1830 and 3rd Mary Reese born 22 July 1826. All are buried at Smyrna Cemetery.

Hicksay McGregor (12 Jan 1865), married Phillip Gysberti Hoodenpyl born 16 Mar 1795, buried at Smyrna Cemetery

Henderson McGregor born 1821 married Martha C. Young born 1828. They are buried at Smyrna Cemetery.

Avery McGregor (1819) married 1st Benjamin Marks (1817) and 2nd Marks Huckabee.

Avery died in Bell County Texas.

Tennessee Land Grant Records show Willis McGregor receiving a land grant for 92 acres located in Warren County on the 5th day of October 1818. The land was located on the Barren Fork of the Collins River. The 1830 Census lists 6 slaves for Willis McGregor and the 1850 Census shows Willis owning real estate valued at \$2000, a considerable sum at that time. Willis died 8 Aug 1861 and he and his wife and at least one of his daughters are buried at Smyrna Cemetery.

Some children of Willis and Susannah (Susan) are:

Myra McGregor(1812-1880) married James Anderson Safely. They are buried at Smyrna Cemetery.


Lavonia Ann McGregor (1820-1880), buried at Riverside Cemetery in McMinnville

Vesta McGregor (1821-1884), buried at Riverside Cemetery in McMinnville

Orpha McGregor (1822-1905 married John Wesley Mitchell (1826-1889). John Wesley is buried at the Old City Cemetery in McMinnville and Orpha died and is buried in Gadsden, AL.

Cynthia Barnett McGregor (1827-1902) married William Swann (1828-1922) in 1868. They are buried at Riverside Cemetery in McMinnville.

If you think you may descend directly or connect to any of these families, check our website (<u>www.tngenweb.org/wcga</u>) for a Pioneer Ancestor application and guidelines for completing the process. Enjoy the research puzzle. Help to honor your ancestor by establishing them as a Pioneer Ancestor of Warren County if they lived in Warren County anytime in the 1807-1820 timeframe. Many research tools are available in the research library of WGHA located in our office at 201 Locust Street (County Administrative Offices). Our office is open on Mondays and Fridays from 9 to 3.
