
We have another interesting program planned for June and we hope that our members will be able to attend.

June 6, 1944 - The D-Day invasion of Normandy by allied troops took place to liberate France and Western Europe from German occupation


June 11, 1987 - Margaret Thatcher became the first British Prime Minister in 160 years to win a third consecutive term




May 17, 2025 Members Meeting

FROM THE MEMORIAL WEBSITE



During the summer of 1944, more than 200 American soldiers fell in the commune of Gouesnou in Finistère, between the first day of the siege of Brest and the battles of Bourgneuf-Fourneuf and Kergroas.

As part of the celebration of the 80th anniversary of Victory, so that their sacrifice is never forgotten and the tragedies of the past are not repeated, the City of Gouesnou has decided to erect a memorial in honor of these Freedom fighters.

Thanks to your support, this monument will honor the memory of each of these men and offer families a true place of remembrance.

The work depicts a life-size sculpted American soldier, an exhausted soldier sitting on a pile of stones, holding his rifle in his hands.

His bayonet rests beside him. Behind his back stands a monumental door on which the names of all his comrades in arms are engraved.

A door, a symbol of freedom, of transition, of the passage from darkness to light, of the heavy sacrifice of these men who came from the other side of the Atlantic to drive out the enemy and help us regain our freedom.

During World War II, Brest was liberated from German occupation on September 18, 1944. Before reaching Brest, several battles took place on the outskirts of the city, notably in Gouesnou between August 7 and September 4, 1944, notably on two strategic points known as "strong points": the ridge lines of Bourgneuf-Fourneuf and the fortified farm of Kergroas. Two American infantry divisions were engaged in these battles and many American soldiers lost their lives.

To reconstruct the story of the events and identify the military and civilian victims, the City of Gouesnou initiated an investigation with the help of numerous partners.

Sometimes we rediscover books on our shelves that are true classics worthy of a new look. This is certainly the case with Tennessee - A History 1673 - 1932.

This title is a four-volume set, published in 1933 by The American Historical Society, Inc. It was written and edited by Philip M. Hamer, Ph.D. who was a professor of history at the University of Tennessee. This set was donated to the WCGHA by Bonnie Davis.

Volumes I and II describe the land, politics, farming, industry, war, transportation and many more topics. Volumes III and IV are both filled with short biographies of Tennesseans. All four books are beautifully bound and published with high-quality paper and wide margins and are filled with photographs of people and places.

In the Foreword the publishers stated the following:

"Dr. Hamer's name as author furnishes all necessary evidence as to the quality and scope of the history of Tennessee that is planned and that is tentatively outlined in these pages. All that remains for the publishers is to pledge the cooperation of an organization highly trained in the production of historical works, to the end that the State may have a history worthy, in content and form, of its proud record. No effort will be spared to make the present work one unsurpassed in its field."
